What is St. Andrew's purpose – our reason for existing?

Is St. Andrew Lutheran Church a congregation that feels like it's going through the motions or are we a congregation that's SINGING because we know our WHY? We've begun the work of articulating our WHY, and now it's time to see how we'll come together around a common purpose.

Your Transition Team will meet next week to review all the comments and draft WHY statements from the "Finding Our WHY" workshop and from the WHY Small Group Conversations. From those notes we will draft three WHY statements that will be sent to the congregation for your consideration.

In prayerful contemplation, please review those draft statements and then gather with your fellow brothers and sisters in Christ at St. Andrew after worship on April 16 for a special Consensus Meeting. The outcome of that meeting will determine whether we still have more work to do or if we're ready to move to exploring the Options for Missional Sustainability on April 30.

Consensus cannot be achieved by a small group within the congregation. Your transition team and your elected leadership need and want everyone to be part of our discernment process. Finding our WHY is a vital step in that process. It will not only ground us as a faith community but will also reside at the core of our decision-making about our future. We look forward to your participation with us in this process!
