#### **Update from the Transition Team**

#### Our Next Transition Event – Sunday, March 26th after worship: "Finding Our WHY"

We've heard the results of St. Andrew's Congregation Assessment Tool (CAT), and now it's time to use that information to get to work. This event is the first step.

Where are you sitting?

You heard in the CAT results that 60% are sitting "on the fence" in Overall Satisfaction and 56% are sitting "on the fence" in Overall Energy. Perhaps you are one of the members on that fence or you are someone who is struggling to understand why anyone would be on the fence. Well, St. Andrew, here is your opportunity to take a good look at that fence and decide if you want to leave folks sitting there or engage them in conversation and action that moves them off the fence. We can't do the work of discernment if so many remain on the fence.

Often, we're on the fence because we have no sense of direction or purpose. We need to know our WHY. The "Finding Our WHY" event is the first step in articulating St. Andrew's WHY statement. This statement expressing our purpose will be the foundation for any decisions we make about our future. We need everyone to be a part of this important work.

In preparation for this event, please make time to reflect on the question: Why are you a part of St. Andrew's? And then engage others in conversation about their thoughts during coffee hour this Sunday.
