On Sunday, May 28, as we celebrate the festival of Pentecost, you are invited to help make a semblance of the noise of the first Pentecost day when the Holy Spirit breathed into the followers of Jesus and moved the Church into action.

In the Book of Acts we read: *"All of them (the followers of Jesus who had gathered in a small upstairs room in Jerusalem) were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability."*
