Pastor's Message

Dear Friends,

Call this a season of discernment.

As we continue to move through this time of transition seeking to determine the future path and shape of ministry for St. Andrew Church, we are called to be especially attentive and available to the guiding and nudging of the Holy Spirit.

Discernment, we discover, is best rooted in prayer — prayer that doesn't ask God to do for us what we think God should do, but that opens us to understand God's purposes and ways for us. "Humility, awe and wonder permeate the life of a congregation that practices discernment," Susan Beaumont has written.

So the summer season will not be a time to sit back and relax as we seek to discern. Rather the days ahead call for thoughtful, expectant prayer, careful and constructive conversation with one another and with new conversation partners, the willingness to be surprised and the courage to follow the Spirit's leading.

With the current reality, pointed out at our May 21 transition meeting after worship, that it will be quite challenging to call a full time pastor in the near future, it is essential for this congregation to consider alternative avenues for life giving ministry in this place and in the greater Bristol community.

The first step in exploring potential new paths toward future ministry will come on June 14 when we have been invited along with folks from three neighboring Lutheran congregations, all in some phase of transition — Gloria Dei and Zion Churches in Bristol and Grace Church in Plainville, to share openly where we are on our journeys in ministry. Please read carefully the invitation letter from Pr. Steven Wilcox, Associate to the Bishop of our New England Synod, included in this newsletter. I encourage your participation. Together we are being called to be a community of open communication, prayer, discernment and hope.

As we lean expectantly and trustingly into the days ahead, I invite your prayers and participation in the process of discernment. And let this prayer from the liturgy of Evening Prayer in our Evangelical Lutheran Worship book continue to be a starting place for your prayers:

O God, you have called your servants to ventures of which we cannot see the ending, by paths as yet untrodden, through perils unknown. Give us faith to go out with courage, not knowing where we go, but only that your hand is leading us and your love supporting us; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

New England Synod Assembly, June 9-10

Jill Little will be serving as St. Andrew Church's delegate at the annual New England Synod Assembly at the DCU Center in Worcester, MA on June 9-10.

Theme for the Assembly will be *A Church Born in the Tomb: Death and Resurrection in the 21st Century Church*. Among the topics to be addressed at the assembly: plans for the 2024 bishop election process, follow-up report on the anti-racism group, presentations on collaboration projects from around the synod, and a conversation about the many ways we are seeing death, resurrection and new ways of being the body of Christ in this century. Worship and a variety of workshops will also help fill the agenda for a busy two days.

Dear Bristol area congregations,

In fall of 2022, a number of transitions in the ELCA churches of Bristol and Plainville caused us to enter a time of parallel discernment, giving each congregation an opportunity to assess its own energy, purpose, and hopes for what comes next. The hope was for each individual congregation to discern their path and to identify any opportunities for collaboration and deepening relationships around our shared mission across congregations. Thank you for engaging this challenging work in each of your own contexts.

In consultation with your transition pastors and consultants, we would like to host an evening of conversation with me, Pr. Steven Wilco, Associate to the Bishop, to lift up some of the good discernment work that has taken place in each congregation and talk together about hopes for what comes next individually and together. This conversation is one of information sharing, not one of decision making. We come with no preconceived assumptions about formal or informal partnerships that could emerge in the future but with the recognition that relationship building and open communication across our congregations is always a fruitful endeavor.

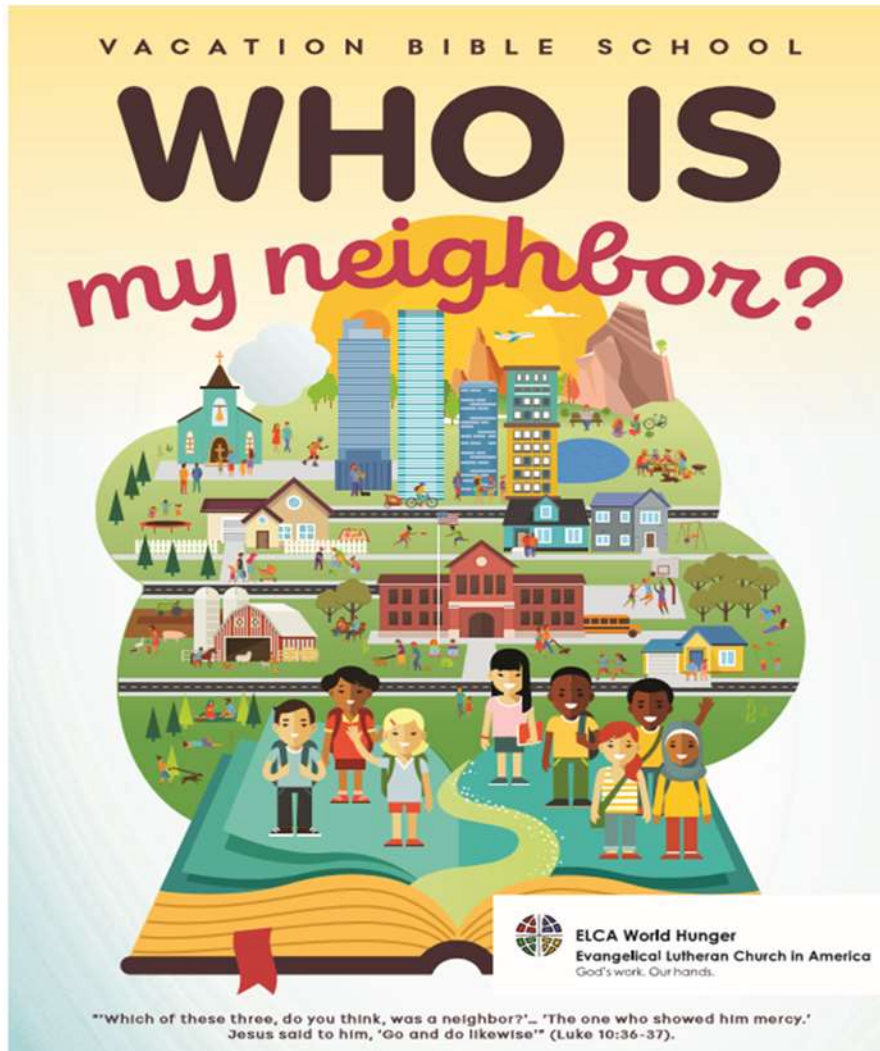
