Bristol Area Lutherans Gather for Discussion about Collaboration in Ministry

On Wednesday evening, June 14, representatives from three Bristol Lutheran congregations (Gloria Dei, Zion and St. Andrew) and Grace Lutheran Church in Plainville gathered in the hall of Bristol's First Congregational Church to share where each is at in their transition process and to discuss the possibilities of collaborative work in the future. The meeting was convened by the Rev. Steven Wilco, Associate to the Bishop of our New England Synod.

More than 25 people from St. Andrew Church (we didn't get an accurate count) participated.

There was a strong sense of enthusiasm and energy in the whole group for moving forward with developing possibilities for working together in ministry.

Two key steps for moving forward:

- The congregations are beginning to plan shared worship services during the month of August. The plan is for the four churches to worship together as one on each of the four Sundays beginning August 6. St. Andrew Church is tentatively scheduled to host worship on August 27. But watch for further details in coming weekly news notes. Our own Karen Biernat is helping to coordinate this collaborative effort.
- Another joint team to work on "moving collaboration forward" will be taking shape during July.
 This group will explore further ways for the churches to do ministry together beyond the August

worship effort (youth ministry, adult learning opportunities, advancing ministries to the Bristol community, etc.). Two representatives from each congregation will soon be appointed by each congregation's Congregation Councils. Pastor Wilco will convene the meeting.

A future gathering inviting all interested people from the four congregations to deepen our sense of partnership and strengthen our Lutheran presence in the Bristol area will be scheduled after the above mentioned joint team meets.

As all four congregations are involved in transition processes, this is an opportune time to talk together about how our ministries might work together in the future.

2023 New England Synod Assembly Update by Jill Little

During the June 18, 2023 service, I gave my thoughts on the 2023 New England Synod Assembly that I attended in Worcester on June 9 and 10 as voting member for St. Andrew's. There were many highlights of this year's Assembly but the most impactful to me was the theme this year - Death and Resurrection in the 21st Century Church. On a personal level, this was very timely with where we find our own church. We are not alone. The sobering numbers in our own New England Synod confirm a decline in attendance. From 2000 to 2020, the average number in the pews decreased from 65 to 37. In 2000, there were 183 congregations declining to 156 congregations in 2020.

The theme was woven throughout the 2 days, including the 2 church services. We heard stories of churches that prayerfully decided to do holy closure, mergers and partnerships. For mergers/partnerships, the message was clear: We are better together. Both churches have to die to create one new church. For example, we heard about Prince of Peace and First Evangelical Lutheran Church in Brockton, MA became one in 2022. I attended a break-out session titled The Changing Church. Panelists were from Christ the Good Shepherd Church in Hamden. This is a merged church comprised of members from Lutheran Church of the Good Shepherd and Christ Lutheran Church. It was interesting to hear their story and how they made it work and how they are moving forward as one. While it was a process for them they were guided by the Holy Spirit that allowed it to happen.

The second break-out session I attended was about partnerships with our close cousins in the Episcopal Church. We heard from Christ the King Epiphany, a federated church in Wilbraham, MA that was formed by a Lutheran congregation and an Episcopal congregation. They became official on January 2020, but they had been sharing ministry for 10 years. We then heard from the pastor of Zion Lutheran in Oxford, MA and Church of Reconciliation (Episcopal) in Webster, MA. He is Pastor at both churches and indicated that "Church is better together." They are not federated but do share in some services and ministries.

The things that merged congregations share is that there has to be a death of their church and grief for the way things used to be. It is then that they can experience Resurrection – a new way of moving forward together. It is important to remember that through all of this we still have the Word of God. Through these stories, I was left hopeful for us. We will have pain and loss, but there is hope that we will become new and better to spread the Word of God. That is what all of us have in common.

The theme was woven into the 2 beautiful church services -Friday at Trinity Lutheran with a sermon by Bishop Regina Hassanally, Southeastern Minnesota Synod and the closing service on Saturday with a spirited sermon by Executive Conference Minister Rev. Darrell Goodwin. Rev. Goodwin spoke in his sermon about the reading from Jeremiah about the Potter's Wheel. We are all called to the potter's

house – like he reshaped the imperfect clay, we can reshape what has been. We can be Reshaped and renewed. If we crack the stone hard, resurrection is possible – don't we all just Love Jesus? It was very inspiring.

A special note for youth and young adults – for those in high school, there will be Youth Gathering in New Orleans from July 16 – 20, 2024. Huge gathering of Lutheran teens from across the USA. At the same time in the same place, a Young Adult gathering will take place. Information about both can be found on the ELCA website.

Help is really needed in the garden if we are to enjoy the fruits of our labor.


Currently, there is only one person doing all of the work.
