THIS SUNDAY, DECEMBER 3, 9:30 A.M. FIRST SUNDAY IN ADVENT, WORSHIP AT ZION LUTHERAN CHURCH, BRISTOL!

This Sunday as we mark the beginning of a new liturgical year and the beginning of the season of Advent, we will gather with our neighboring Lutheran congregations at Zion Lutheran Church, 27 Judd Street, Bristol.

It is a joy to worship with the folks from Zion, Gloria Dei and Grace Lutheran Churches as we continue to grow our partnership in ministry and lean with hope and expectation into the year ahead.

A festive coffee hour will follow worship, a wonderful time to continue building relationships with one another.

Advent literally means "coming" and the season is filled with reminders that it is not only the miraculous birth of a child born to bring new life and hope to us that we await, but it is the coming again of that child who became our crucified-risen Lord to complete what he has begun and to bring his new creation to fulfillment.

At Advent, God's people summon the courage and the spiritual strength to remember that the holy breaks into the daily. In tiny ways, we can open our broken hearts to the healing grace of God, who opens the way of peace. May that peace come upon us as a healing balm, as a mighty river, gushing and rising through the valleys of our [fears and anxieties]...Advent is not a season for passive waiting and watching. It is a season...of opening up our lives and our souls with active anticipation and renewed hope. (From "Feasting on the Word...Advent Companion," WJK publishers, 2014)

We will return to St. Andrew Church to worship for the remainder of the Advent season on December 10.

An idea for Advent Home Devotions...

As you pullout your four candle Advent wreath or make a new one and light one candle at the beginning of each week, use the Litany for Lighting the Wreath that we will also be using during worship on Sundays. There is a special theme for each week — Hope, Peace, Joy and Love. Let the dawning light of Christ shine in your home as you journey through this season!

In the weeks to come, you will find the Advent Candle Lighting Litany in the bulletin attached at the end of these NewsNotes, or bring the Sunday bulletin home with you each week. (And let the Prayer of the Day and the readings heard in worship ring again in your hearts and minds through the week.) But because we will be at Zion Church this week, here is the litany for the first week in Advent. (If you are gathered around the table as a family, share the reading out loud together. Or if you are alone, read the prayer silently or aloud.)

Week One:

When I look around, I see shadows of hunger. So many neighbors, nearby and around the world, will go to bed hungry tonight...

When I look around, I see shadows of injustice, the rich getting richer and the poor getting poorer—and someone somewhere will fall asleep under a bridge tonight...

In the face of hunger, we light a candle of hope...

In the face of injustice, in the face of despair, we light a candle of hope... (Light the first candle in your Advent wreath.)

May the light from this candle overcome the world.

May the light from this candle say to all that God's hope is coming, on earth as it already is in heaven.

Be not afraid, God's hope is at hand!

Clear out the cluttered heart

Clear out the cluttered heart, lest like the crowded inn, there is no room, no way to part a path to let Christ in.
