A note on gratefulness in this time of Thanksgiving...

I've always wondered if St. Paul was a bit too sunny when he encouraged his friends of the church in Thessalonica who were struggling to live faithfully in the midst of a confusing and turbulent time to "Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances, for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." (1 Thessalonians 5.16-18). Thanks in all circumstances? Really?

Then one day I was introduced to a Benedictine monk, David Steindl-Rast, who resides in a monastery in Austria and has spent decades of his life reflecting, writing and speaking about gratitude. He's even got a great website focused on this what has become a rather popular topic these days: gratefulness.org. It's worth a good look.

We hear it often that grateful people are healthier people. Scientific studies confirm it. Grateful people, we are told, live robust, resilient, more joyful lives. Maybe St. Paul was onto something.

Brother Steindl-Rast has a rather simple method for practicing gratefulness. He suggests three things: **Stop. Look. Go.**

Stop, he says, in the midst of all the rush and crazy busy-ness of your life. Stop and simply be present in the moment. It doesn't have to be long, your stop. A split second may be enough.

Stop and look, he invites. Take in the moment, the people, the memory, the promise, the beauty, the connectedness in that place where you are. To look is to behold, to take it all in. Listen attentively too in that moment, I would add...to the music in the winds, the chirping of the bright red cardinal in the backyard, the melancholy of the cello, the throbbing of your anxious heart, the nearly silent prayers and cries rising from the darkness.

And when you stop and look (and listen too) ask yourself: "what is, now, the opportunity of this given moment, only this moment, and the unique opportunity this moment gives? And that is where the beholding comes in. And if we really see what the opportunity is, we must, of course, not stop there, but we must do something with it: **Go.** Avail yourself of that opportunity."

And to those doubtful that we can give thanks in "all circumstances," Steindl-Rast provides wisdom: "...no, we can't be grateful for everything that befalls us. You can't be grateful for war in a given situation, or violence, or domestic violence or sickness...There are many things for which you cannot be grateful. But in every moment, you can be grateful. For instance, the opportunity to learn something from a very difficult experience — what to grow by it, or even to protest, to stand up and take a stand — that is a wonderful gift in a situation in which things are not the way they ought to be. So opportunity is really the key when people ask, "Can you be grateful for everything?" — no, not for everything, but in every moment." Could this be what St. Paul meant when he said, "be thankful in all circumstances?"

I invite you to rejoice these days in the One who opens the eyes of our hearts to see opportunities for gratitude even when things are not at all the way they ought to be, the One who frees us to rejoice always, who assures us that the cries of our prayers are heard, that our work in Jesus' name is not in vain, that the God of peace is with us always giving birth to a new creation, making all things new.


