• The Four Church Collaboration Committee met at Zion Church on January 31 to follow up on the

large Four Church Forum held at Gloria Dei Church on Sunday afternoon, January 28. Over 100 people from the four congregations participated in lively and constructive small and whole group conversation facilitated by the Rev. Steven Wilco, Associate to the Bishop of the New England Synod. The Committee continues to work on a formal "Proposal for a New Ministry" that will be presented to the next Four Church Forum to be held at St. Andrew Church on Sunday afternoon, March 10, beginning at 1:00.

- In order to help the members of our congregations determine where a new congregation will be housed in the future, **Open Houses** will be held at St. Andrew Church on Sunday, February 18, 11:00 a.m. -1:00 p.m., and at Gloria Dei Church, on Sunday afternoon, February 25, 11:00 a.m. 1:00 p.m. The buildings will be open for members of our congregations to tour and assess the potential for a new ministry to be centered in them. Guides will be available in each location in order to answer questions and receive feedback. The Proposal for a New Ministry presented by the Collaboration Team will include a recommendation for the site. (It will also include the recommendation that the New Ministry will retain the Zion Church building in order to continue the vital Meals for Neighbors ministry.
