From the Upper Room to the Cross and to Endless Alleluias




Maundy Thursday, March 28, 7:00 p.m. Four Church Worship at Gloria Dei Church,

SPECIAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING, APRIL 7, TO VOTE ON CONSOLIDATION PROPOSAL

A special congregational meeting on Sunday, April 7, has been called for the people of St. Andrew Church to vote on the Proposal for a New Lutheran Ministry in Bristol and Plainville that was presented by the Four Church Collaboration Committee at a meeting for the four congregations on Sunday, March 10. The meeting will be held after worship.

The Proposal calls for the St. Andrew Church building to be the location for the new ministry with the Zion Church location to continue serving as the location of the Meals for Neighbors ministry. An outline for the steps ahead leading to the four congregations (Grace, Plainville; Zion, Gloria Dei and St. Andrew, Bristol) joining together as one is included in the Proposal. Approval of the proposal will propel forward the formal processes of consolidation, including the formation of a Transition Steering Committee and the formation of a Call Committee to search for a new pastor to serve the new congregation.

Please read the Proposal carefully before the Congregational Meeting. Final copies of the Proposal were sent to the congregation this Monday either via email or land mail. If you have questions regarding the Proposal, please speak to the St. Andrew members of the Collaboration Committee: Karen Biernat, Arlene Creswell, Owen VanBrocklin, Bob Herold, and Pastor Swenson. And continue to keep this process in your prayers that we may all remain open to the Spirit at work among us.

The Congregation Council has nominated the following people to serve on the new Transition Steering Committee which will guide our congregations through the next months: Karen Biernat, Bill Golden and Bob Herold. Arlene Creswell and Britt Lynch have been nominated to serve on the Call Committee to search for and nominate for congregational approval a person to serve as pastor. Three people from each of the four existing congregations will serve on the Steering Committee. Two from each congregation will serve on the Call Committee. The election for these positions will be held after the congregation votes on the Proposal on April 7.
